




Maxine Simpson-Smith

Each of our Scottish settings undergo reviews by the Scottish Care Inspectorate, looking at the quality of care and ensuring it meets high standards.


In October 2021, Pied Piper Nursery in Glasgow received an unannounced visit from the Care Inspectorate. We're pleased to report that since our last inspection we have improved or maintained across all areas, receiving the highest grade in 3/4 areas. Here's some of what the inspectors had to say:

- Children were relaxed and engaged in their play. This suggested they felt comfortable and secure in the setting and with the staff caring for them.
- · Staff were warm, calm and nurturing for children. The manager understood the need to continually support staff to reflect on their interactions with children, to contribute to their positive outcomes.
- · All children had a personal plan which outlined their health and wellbeing needs. Staff knew children and their needs well, providing responsive and consistent care. This allowed children to feel secure that their needs would be met.
